MAYOR'S REPORT

I want to express my thanks to all the residents for the many kind expressions of concern and sympathy following my wife's death.

I have received a number of remarks concerning our **police activity on Cleveland Avenue** and have discussed this matter with our Chief of Police, who explained that this additional effort is a result of complaints from residents that the volume of traffic on Cleveland Avenue has increased tremendously in the past few years. This traffic often moves at a speed well above the posted rate, making it difficult and even dangerous to exit from our village onto Cleveland Avenue. The police effort has resulted in slowing traffic, but it has also created an image of a "New Rome"-like speed trap. If you have any thoughts on this situation, give me a call. I would like to hear from you.

I hear that MPCA's annual **garage sale** went well, despite the rain.

We have a **street-sealing**

project out for bids. The project should be started in late July and, weather permitting, should be completed by early August. The streets to be sealed include Park Lane Court, Park Lane Drive, a 100-foot length of the east end of Jordan Road, Maplewood Drive, Lakewood Drive from Alder Visit Drive to Maplewood Drive, and Lakeland Court. The contractor will provide notifications to all resident on these streets before beginning work, indicating start and completion times.

The chair of our Service Committee reported that he has discussed our **trash pick-up** program with Rumpke to resolve any complaints he may have received. He also reported that he has begun to work on the **leaf pick-up** program for this fall.

The Planning & Zoning chairman reported that he will continue to report on the **established codes for construction and vehicle parking**.

Resolution 2003-08 - Passed - Authorized the Mayor and Clerk-Treasurer to enter into a contract



with Lisa Pride BMV Auditing.

Resolution 2003-09 - Passed - To accept an easement deed for property along Cleveland Avenue.

Ordinance 01-2003 - First Reading - To increase the salary of the Mayor from \$12,000 per year to \$24,000 per year.

Ordinance 02-2003 - First Reading - To increase the salary of the council member from \$50 per year to \$50 per month.

The meeting was closed with a very energetic discussion during the citizen's comments session concerning the **parking of commercial vehicles**. I suspect this matter will be discussed at length in the future.

West Nile Virus

Where does it come from?

West Nile Virus is an arbovirus—that is, a virus carried by arthropods, such as mosquitoes and ticks. It is classified as a zoonosis, a disease communicable from animals to humans. Birds—especially crows, blue jays, hawks, and owls—are the principal hosts for WNV. The main route of human infection is through the bite of an infected mosquito. There are documented cases of transmission of WNV through blood transfusions, organ transplants, and one case of breastfeeding.

How to Prevent WNV

The Centers for Disease Control suggests the following.

1. Avoid being outdoors at dawn and dusk.
2. Apply insect repellent containing DEET (N,N-diethyl-metaltoluamide) when you are outdoors.
3. When possible, wear long-sleeve clothes and long pants sprayed with repellants.
4. Be sure your doors and windows have tight-fitting screens without holes or tears.
5. Eliminate standing water around your home, such as plastic containers, garbage cans, and gutters. Keeping swimming pools clean and chlorinated. Change water in bird baths every 3-4 days.

Remember, Minerva Park will be spraying high-risk areas every 2 weeks, as noted in earlier Villager issues.

Symptoms

While most WNV cases are mild or even unnoticeable, this is a very serious virus that should not be taken lightly, especially in young children and the elderly. WNV has a 3- to 14-day incubation period, with symptoms lasting 3-6 days. Common symptoms are sudden onset of fever, accompanied by symptoms such as malaise, nausea, vomiting, eye pain, headache, muscle tenderness or pain, rash, and lymphadenopathy (disease of the lymph nodes). Severe infection may cause aseptic meningitis and encephalitis. Such severe neurological disease may be marked by stiffness in the neck, rash, tremors, chills, convulsions, severe muscle weakness, photosensitivity, flaccid paralysis, confusion, and—in rare cases—death.

Testing and Treatment

The IgM antibody, capture enzyme-linked immunosorbent assay (MAC-ELISA) is the most efficient method of confirming a case of WNV.

There is no specific treatment for WNV, expect to address the symptoms. Human vaccines for WNV are under development and could be available in 3 years.

Three houses on Maplewood Drive have lost 16 trees in only 2 years. Arborists we contacted stressed that a maintenance program and spraying for this insect would have saved our trees. Biannual maintenance from a certified arborist would have been far less costly than tree removal, and we would still have our beloved shade.



Did You Know?

Minerva Park has made an effort in the past month to resolve some of the difficulties we have been experiencing with compliance of some of our most common ordinances. Below is a summary of where we stand as of June 20.

Note that a single location may have more than one issue associated with it.

We really appreciate the effort made by the residents of the 12 above-referenced locations to resolve the code issues and do their part to make Minerva Park a safer and more attractive residential neighborhood. We currently have sent approximately 25 letters to businesses and homeowners, so we are batting about 50% after only 1 month! Additional letters are being prepared, and our code enforcement officer will be following up with appropriate actions on those notices already sent. Included in last month's list were very generalized references to parking or storing boats, trailers, campers, and mobile homes.

This month we will explain these issues in more detail by referencing and explaining the applicable ordinances. The italicized sections below are taken directly from the existing current Codified Ordinances of Minerva Park OH, with replacement portions dated 1999 and later amended in 2002.

Recreational Vehicles, Boats & Trailers in Minerva Park

Planning & Zoning Code - Section 1230.04 – Definitions

(27) "Yard, side" means an open, unoccupied space on the same lot with a structure, between the side line of the structure, exclusive of steps, and the side of the lot, extending from the front line to the rear line of the building.

Section 1246.03 – Development Standards

(b) Side Yards – For dwellings or associated

accessory buildings there shall be a total of eighteen feet or more, with a minimum of eight feet on one side.

Section 1272.04 – Comprehensive and Neighborhood Improvements

"(b)(G) There shall be no outdoor storage of equipment or materials used in the home occupation."

Section 1282.08 Amended 2002 – Parking in Residential Districts

"(b) Recreational and other large vehicles –The off-street parking of a recreational vehicle, boat, boat trailer, camper, coach motor home, tent trailer, travel trailer, or utility trailer is permitted subject to the following conditions:

- 1) *None of the above may be parked in the required front or side yard, except they may be parked in a driveway for not longer than forty-eight hours for any calendar week for loading or unloading.*
- 2) *Side or rear yard parking of such vehicles shall not intrude on the minimum side and rear yard requirement set forth in this code*
- 3) *All such parking shall be as close to the structure as practical, but not closer than the 2 feet nor farther than 20 feet.*
- 4) *For side or rear yard storage the length of the vehicle shall not exceed the length of the structures adjacent wall.*
- 5) *No such camping or recreational vehicle shall have a fixed connection to electricity, gas, water or sewer, nor shall such be used as a dwelling in any case.*

Clearly the intent of these four sections is to provide for only restricted long-term storage of your personal camping and recreational equipment with special provisions for loading and unloading purposes.


- Limit your loading and unloading to forty eight hours.
- Don't park or store in the front yard or in the minimum 8 foot side yard, except for loading or unloading via the driveway.
- Position the vehicle according to paragraphs 2-4 of Section 1282.08.
- Don't attach to utilities or live in the vehicle.

If you need any further clarification of these ordinances, please contact **Fred Lappert**, Minerva Park's **Code Enforcement Officer**, at **267-8353**.

If you take the approach of respecting your neighbor's right to a residential look and avoid "open" storage, you will be helping stem the tide of visual pollution, keeping Minerva Park a quality residential community. Thanks to all for your continued cooperation.


